- **The Lord Leycester** –Winter: closed 24th December to 1st March. Summer (April-Sept) Tuesday to Sunday 10am-5pm (last admission 4pm), Autumn: Tuesday to Sunday 10am to 4pm (last admission 3pm);. Nine hundred years ago the Lord Leycester Chapel was built. In the 1300s the Guilds built the half-timbered buildings you see today – some of the most important examples of intact medieval architecture in Britain.
